## Table Runner Pattern

Approximate finished size $21 \times 70$ inches Designed by Cindy Roth

Make this simple Table Runner and quilt it with the 1 inch Sashiko Circles Template.


| Fabrics | Cutting wof = width of fabric |

| Light Fabric - 3/4 yard | 1-61/2 inch $x$ wof strips <br> Cut into $4-61 / 2 \times 61 / 2$ inch squares (A) <br> 6-31/2 inch $x$ wof strips <br> Cut into $8-31 / 2 \times 151 / 2$ inch rectangles (E) <br> Cut into $8-31 / 2 \times 91 / 2$ inch rectangles (D) |
| Dark Fabric - 3/4 yard | 4-3 $1 / 2$ inch $x$ wof strips (outer border) <br> 6-2 inch $x$ wof strips <br> Cut into $8-2 \times 61 / 2$ inch rectangles (B) <br> Cut into $8-2 \times 91 / 2$ inch rectangles (C) <br> Cut into $3-2 \times 151 / 2$ inch rectangles (F) |
| Binding-1/2 yard | Cut 5 wof strips in the desired size for your binding of choice. |
| Backing - 2-1/4 yard Batting of choice |  |

## Simple Table Runner Pattern

All seams are $1 / 4$ inch. Press towards darker fabric or as desired.

Take pieces $A, B$, and $C$ and lay out as shown at the right.
Stitch, then press.


Take pieces D and E and lay out as shown at the right.

Stitch, then press.


Take the F pieces and stitch them between the blocks as shown below. Press. Add the $31 / 2$ inch borders in your usual way. Press.


You can quilt this Table Runner any way you desire.

If you are using the 1 inch Sashiko Circles template, here is a suggested quilting plan.
Blocks 1 and 3
Inner square, Overlapping Circles
Outer (light) area, Circles All Over

## Blocks 2 and 4

Inner Square, Fish Net Version 2
Outer (light) area, Fish Net Version 1

## Inner (dark) Block Sashing

Border designs show in this instruction manual

## Sashing Between Blocks

Border - Middle to the Corners, stopping short of the seam.

## Outer Border

Ying Yang border using 2 inch diameter Sashiko Circles template and the 1 inch diameter Sashiko Circles template.

Note \#1: Refer to the 2 inch Sashiko Circles Template manual to learn how to quilt the Ying Yang design.

Note \# 2: Outer Border is slightly oversized. It can be trimmed after quilting is completed.
