Items you will need for the quilting -
Thread - Use whatever thread works in your quilting machine. When quilting this type of sampler style quilt, I like to use contrasting thread so that my quilting will show! The quilting of this quilt is the focal point!
Templates \& Stencil Grids - This quilt uses the Longarm University Curved Cross Hatch template. For information about this template go to

The Curved Cross Hatch template works with a grid system that is drawn onto your fabric. To have the most accurate grids, the Longarm University 1 inch Stencil Grid is highly recommended. For information about this Stencil Grid go to

Other items you will need -
If you are using the Feather Guide templates, you will need a base unit or table for your quilting machine. DO NOT QUILT TEMPLATES WITHOUT A BASE UNIT!!

Temporary Quilt Basting Spray - I prefer the June Taylor brand, but any brand will work.

Marking pens of choice. I prefer the Fine Point Crayola Washable Markers. Note - to remove the marker, the quilt MUST be washed in warm water, with detergent, in a washing machine.
Straight edge rotary cutting rulers for marking registration lines.
Safety pins for pin basting.
